

## **2006 RallyCross Safety and Sportsmanship Revisions**

**Registration:** All registration will now be conducted online via [www.wdcr-scca.org](http://www.wdcr-scca.org). Entry will close the Friday prior to each event at midnight. On-site registration will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Late arrival/registration penalties may apply.

**Close of registration:** No one will be permitted to enter the event after registration closes. Pre-paid entrants will not have their entry fee returned unless they provided 24 hours notice that they will not be competing or the event is canceled by the organizers.

### **Worker Placement Procedure**

All competitors must check-in with their group's worker captain during any heat they are not driving. All competitors must work when they are not driving. This means each competitor will have to work two (2) heats each. Heats can last 1 – 2 hours. Plan accordingly for cold, heat, sun, dust, etc.

Workers should be in position prior to each stage drive-thru. Worker placement will be confirmed via radio roll call. Failure to appear will result in a Did Not Work (DNW) on the event scoresheet. The competitor will receive no championship points and times may not be reported.

### **Spectator Safety Regulations:**

- No persons other than authorized organizers or course workers shall be in the vicinity of the course (delineated by the natural 'tree wall' bordering the course area for the Oakland Acres event) unless in designated spectator areas which will be marked off by yellow caution tape.
- No unsupervised children anywhere on the property.
- No breaking, crossing, relocating, or otherwise tampering with the caution tape that delineates the spectator area.
- Entering the restricted area will result in a red flag on course until the situation is remedied. Course Workers are responsible for monitoring spectators, alerting the Event Steward, and displaying the red flag if needed.

### **Grounds for Disqualification, Probation, and Exclusion (the "6 and 6" rule)**

The 2006 SCCA RallyCross Rules, Article 5.2, rule I, page 10, stipulates "Competitors driving in an unsafe manner at or near the event location, or displaying unsportsmanlike conduct, shall be disqualified." For the purposes of WDCR-SCCA RallyCross, violations that will result in disqualification of the competitor from the event and forfeiture of entry fees will include, but not be limited to:

- **Unsafe Conduct while Driving – UCD:** Excessive off-course driving, not stopping when red flag is waved, partial or full rollover due to excessive corner entry speed and drift-angle, speeding on the property outside of the competition course, etc.
  - **Unsportsmanlike Conduct – UC:** Swearing, Cheating, Yelling, etc.
- Because the WDCR-SCCA region's RallyCross program is increasing in attendance, both competitor and spectator, a necessary focus on safety and quality of the event requires the following additional rule:

Upon disqualification, the competitor will be placed on **probation** for the next six (6) events, regardless of calendar date. Any additional infraction by the competitor during the probation period will result in **exclusion** for six (6) events from the date of the second violation. The Safety and Event Steward will have final say on all penalties assessed.

**Probation** and **Exclusion** will be delivered and explained in written form to the competitor, approved by the Safety and Event Steward, and publicly posted. All appeals must be made, in writing, to the Event Steward.

Probation and Exclusion List

**As of 1 January 2006, the probation list does not have any names listed. The probation list will be maintained by the Director of RallyCross. The probation list will not be publicly posted, but it is not considered private information. Thus, the list will be available upon request. The exclusion list is treated identically.**
